■ Along with its strong focus on emergency services, which generated an overall rating of “Excellent” during its most recent U.S. Air Force evaluation, the Indiana Wing continues to invest strongly in education.

Every summer, the wing plays a vital role at Civil Air Patrol’s National Emergency Services Academy at Camp Atterbury in Edinburgh. In 2019 aircrew training was led by the wing’s inspector general, Lt. Col. Robert Freese. Numerous other wing

members participated, helping train search and rescue pilots as well as future U.S. Air Force pilots under a joint program between the Air Force and CAP.

Meanwhile, in classrooms across the state, teachers enjoyed tools provided by Civil Air Patrol to excite their students’ interest in STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) learning. And outside the class, the wing provided TOP (Teacher Orientation Program) Flights to educators

from Goshen Community Schools, School City of Mishawaka, Westfield Washington School District, Lake Station Community Schools and Monroe County Community School Corp.
