Wing Members Continuously Prepare To Be Of Service

■ Wisconsin Wing members engage in training and development throughout the year to be able to respond to the needs of their communities. These training opportunities focus on enabling both new and experienced members to develop new skills, form new working relationships and gain new insights.

In the area of emergency services, Wisconsin Wing members develop capabilities on the ground, in the air and in mission management. Each year the wing hosts a Ground Team Academy and a Mission Aircrew Academy where members come to Volk Field Air National Guard Base for training in basic and advanced search techniques. They then return to their home communities and form the backbone of the wing's search capability. In addition,

experienced members who are looking to help by managing missions come to Volk Field to participate in the Mission Base and Staff Academy, where they learn how to manage a search, track mission resources and carry out rescue missions.

A highlight of the wing's cadet program is a Noncommissioned Officer School focused on helping cadets prepare for advanced leadership and better support their squadrons. A similar school is offered to the wing's newest cadets to ensure they have a solid footing as they begin their CAP journey. In 2019 the wing added a new school focused on bringing the tenets of servant leadership to both cadets and adults working with cadets. Members also attended the annual Viterbo University Servant Leadership Conference.

The wing carries out CAP's aerospace education mission by equipping its members with knowledge and skills to engage their communities in aerospace. The wing's annual Aerospace Education Weekend engages young and old in STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) activities that not only provide an opportunity to learn but also introduce participants to activities and projects they can take home to their communities.
